Course outcome: After passing the exam student acquires basic knowledge that enables him to carry out tasks of international character as well as active participation in the process of harmonization and association with the EU.			
Contents of the course			
<i>Theoretical classes.</i> Historical emergence of the European Union. Contracts on the creation and development of the European Community - European Union. Legal regulations and sources of EU law, with particular reference to the Maastricht Treaty. Study of EU institutions in accordance with the Lisbon Treaty, and a special emphasis on the specificity of the inter-functional connection of these institutions. Legal subjectivity and its effect as well as the problem of determining the legal nature of the EU.			
<i>Practical classes.</i> Introducing students with secondary sources of EU law, in particular regulations, absorption capacity issues, the perspective of enlargement or reorganization of the Union itself. Pointing to practical problems in the functioning of the EU institutions, and the problems that the Union itself is facing today. Preparation of colloquium and exams. Evaluation of realized teaching and analysis of its results.
